7. Dress Code		
I will dress appropriately for the season, in clothes that are clean and neat.	By dressing appropriately and practising good personal hygiene at school, I show that I respect myself and others.	Teachers and administrators will exercise discretion in ensuring all students are dressed appropriately.

8. Smoking		
Bringing cigarettes, vaping materials, matches, or lighters on school property, on field trips and on buses at all times, by students and adults is prohibited. <u>10. Laser Pointers</u>		
I will not bring laser pointers onto school property at any time.	Laser pointers can permanently damage someone's eyes.	The DDSB has banned the use of laser pointers in its schools. If this item is confiscated, it will not be returned to a student—a parent will need to come to the school to collect it. According to the Code of Conduct, students who possess and/or use a laser pointer will be <b>suspended</b> from school.
11. <u>Respect for Authority</u>

The teaching staff, secretaries, custodians and lunchroom supervisors all work hard to make my year happy and successful. 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12. Respect for Property		
<ul> <li>I will treat the school grounds, the building and everything in the school with the same respect I have for my own personal property.</li> <li>I will use the garbage and recycling containers placed throughout the school and in the vicinity outside the school.</li> <li>I will keep my workspace neat and tidy, free from graffiti and inappropriate photos or signs.</li> <li>I will use the computer appropriately, following the DDSB Computer Use Agreement and my Digital License Agreement.</li> </ul>	The school is the property of the community. Custodians maintain the school building, keep it in good repair and keep it tidy but are not responsible for cleaning up messes that I make deliberately. Technology and books are the property of the school and are loaned to me to use during the school year. These items are very expensive so I need to be careful with them so they can be used by myself and other students in the future.	I will be expected to clean up after myself if I litter. If I damage, destroy, or lose school property, repayment could take the form of cost replacement or task-oriented service for recovery of lost items or damaged property. If I misuse or abuse school property or services, including school technology (ChromeBooks, laptops, iPads), I may be suspended.
<b>13.</b> Appropriate Use of Technology It is the practice of the Durham District School Board that the use of electronic devices is prohibited during the school- day on school property. Unless deemed appropriate by the school administration for educational purposes and permission is granted by staff, a student who brings a personal electronic device to school, should turn it off and keep it out of sight. Personal electronic devices may be utilized off school property or in designated areas and during times assigned by the school.	Personal electronic devices that are used inappropriately during the school day are disruptive to the teacher and learning environment. The privacy and personal dignity of others could be violated by the inappropriate use of personal electronic devices to text message, social network, and/or share digital media. In addition, activities such as personal communication, game playing and social media use during class time may distract students from the teaching and learning unless it is part of the teacher's lesson. On-line activity by staff, students and parents/guardians that is directly or indirectly related to the school should comply with School Code of Conduct, in particular that a school is a place that promotes responsibility, respect, civility and safety in the teaching and learning environment.	<ul> <li>Students who do not abide by their Digital Citizenship agreement will experience the following progressive consequences:</li> <li>Step 1: Student will have a conversation with teacher and administration and a warning will be given. Parents/guardians will be contacted</li> <li>Step 2: Loss of device for the day – locked safely in the office until the end of the school day. Parents/Guardians will be contacted.</li> <li>Step 3: Loss of device until a parent/guardian can arrange to pick it up in person. Parent/Guardian will be contacted.</li> <li>*Please note that any damage to DDSB issued ChromeBooks are the responsibility of the parent/guardian.</li> </ul>

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<b><u>14. Photos, Video and Audio Recording</u></b> The taking of photos, filming or recording or the broadcasting of live audio and/or video, while at school or at a school-related activity, is prohibited unless approved by DDSB (or school) and/or where proper consents have been obtained, as may be appropriate.	In keeping with the Education Act and the Municipal Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act, unauthorized video or audio recording on school grounds for any purpose is prohibited. Further, the taking of photos, filming, or recording while at school or at a school-related activity, is prohibited unless approved by DDSB staff for educational purposes. In particular, filming and/or recording is strictly prohibited in washrooms and change rooms. However, this is not intended to prohibit sanctioned recording of activities at events open to the general public.	As deemed appropriate by the Durham District School Board.
